Focus for English and Maths learning next week:

(Our staff differentiate work to ensure the 'right kids get the right stuff at the right time')

Sotherton	Maths: Money English: Have an ugly bug ball-head wear making pebble minibeasts
Murray	Maths: I can recognise and name common 3-D shapes, including: cuboids (including cubes), pyramids and spheres English: Captain Plank's Pirate Adventure
Moore	Maths: I can solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods, and multiplication and division facts, including problems in contexts English: Children will write poetry to accompany the images of dragons within the book
Briggs	Maths: Interpret and present discrete and continuous data using appropriate graphical methods, including bar charts and time graphs English: Children to study Egyptian Cinderella. Look at the similarities and differences with our traditional version
Martin	Maths: I can understand and use equivalences between metric units and common imperial units such as inches, pounds and pints. English: Solve problems involving converting from hours to minutes; minutes to seconds; years to months; weeks to days.
Attrill	Maths: I can multiply proper fractions and mixed numbers by whole numbers, supported by materials and diagrams. English: I can draft and write by using a wide range of devices to build cohesion within and across paragraphs
Lacey	Maths: Use written division methods in cases where the answer has up to two decimal places English: I can use contextual and genre knowledge to determine alternate meanings of known words
