SCIENCE

This term we will be investigating Rocks and Soils. The Big Questions will be: What is the Earth made from?

GEOGRAPHY, HISTORY and SPANISH

In Geography we will be learning about Volcanos and earthquakes. Key questions will include: How are volcanoes formed? How do volcanoes have an impact on people's lives? What are some of the most famous volcanoes called and where are they? How are earthquakes created? How do earthquakes impact on people's lives?

ENGLISH
