MAKING IT HAPPEN ON NATIONAL WRITING DAY!

On Wednesday the UK celebrated National Writing Day! Sadly a survey by the National Literacy Society published this week, captured that only 1 in 4 children and young people aged 8-18 years shared that they enjoy writing in their free time and only 1 in 10 shared that they write something daily in their free time. It seems the love of writing is sadly diminishing.



We know that it is important to develop a love of writing from the very early years which is why developing Early Writing has been a whole school priority this year. In the Early Years, we've embraced new programmes called Story Dough and Drawing Club, which blend storytelling, drawing and early composition to help our youngest learners build confidence and creativity in writing. The results have been truly inspiring, and we're already seeing our little authors writing with more confidence and creativity.

We're so proud of every pupil's progress and can't wait to see how their writing continues to grow.

SO WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

This week following the Isle of Wight festival, in preschool we have been celebrating our own mini festival with the little learners. The children have been dynamic designers and made their own bunting flags. We used a variety of tools to help us. Rulers to draw lines, scissors to cut, hole punch, string to thread and pencils and felts to decorate. Our little learners have been expressing themselves and moving their whole bodies to a variety of music, we made up our very own playlist of the children's favourite songs. We have used all our senses when exploring a variety of music and instruments and talked to the children about how music make us feel.



This week we have been celebrating the importance and enjoyment of music within Early Years. We have listened and learnt about different instruments and instruments from around the world. We decorated our environment and enjoyed a festival themed day on Thursday. To support our learning and music experiences, we were very lucky to have some parents come and play for us in school. During the week, we have also enjoyed some texts about the sea and as part of Drawing Club we have watched Captain Pugwash. Drawing the sea monster and making treasure maps. In Maths we have continued learning how to use the

rekenreks and we have used these to show and support our learning of doubles numbers up to 10. In PSHE we listened to the story 'Once we were giants' and we talked about the different stages of growing up and how we have changed since we were babies.

This Week Rosen class started our new English book 'Ruby's Worry.' We started by discussing what being 'worried' means and maybe if we have an experience of this. We predicted what Ruby's worry could be and shared lots of great ideas. It has been all things money in Maths this week. We have looked at coins and notes and used our toy coins to represent how many coins could be in a note. In Science, we spoke about how ocean animals adapt to survive in their habit. The children have done well linking their knowledge of animal features and habitats. We have started our new topic fruit kebabs in DT. We spoke about different fruits and their taste and textures in preparation for creating a fruit kebab for a class party.



This week in Year 2 we have been learning about Sarah Forbes Bonetta and why she was a significant person in history. In Maths, we have been finding quarters, thirds and what a whole is in shapes and numbers. We have been learning about prepositions and adverbs and using a picture from Journey by Aaron Becker to write fantastic sentences using these. Then we planned our own story where we went through a magic door.

We have had a very busy week. In addition to our involvement in the Key Stage Two performance, in which we did staggeringly well, especially considering that it was our very first one, we have done lots of learning in Science. In particular we have been learning about light. We have been investigating whether materials are transparent, translucent, or opaque, and also whether or not they are reflective. We have carried out fair tests and we have also used Venn diagrams to record our results. In addition to this, we have been continuing to enjoy the adventures of the Wild Robot, and also having lots of fun activities in PE.



This week has seen the whole of KS2 perform in 3 performances of Charlie and the chocolate factory at Ryde Academy. The children were all amazing. We started our new topic Ancient Greeks in History. We looked at how Ancient Greece was split into the 2 states Athens and Sparta. We researched how the 2 city states and their people were very different and led different lives. This week saw us start our statistics unit in Maths looking at interpreting and drawing bar charts and line graphs. Producing our non-chronological reports on bees was the focus of our writing this week in English, ensuring we used sub-headings, paragraphs and subordination. During PSHE/SRE this week we looked at puberty and the changes that

happen to both boys and girls. We then looked at what periods are. The children were very mature when discussing this topic.

Year 5 have shown fantastic resilience and perseverance this week to show that they can make it happen with our Key Stage Two production. We have been so proud of all of the singing and acting efforts they have shown. On the water, Year 5 took part in a Pico racing regatta. This was great fun and highlighted our competitive natures (including Mrs Holloway's!). Year 5 have also shown great teamwork this week by organising and inviting the whole school to their 'Fun with Friends Fayre' to raise money for Isle of Wight Youth Trust.

This week in Year 6 we completed a mini-project based on the Disney film 'Zootopia'. We created a missing persons report for one of the mammals who goes missing in the film. We researched information about species, habitat, diet and the animal's weight and height to complete our missing persons report. We wrote a short speech to give at a mock press conference. We focused on using a formal tone and then we considered how we conveyed the message: looking directly at our audience; speaking in a clear voice. As we got closer to the key stage two production of 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory', we took part in whole cast rehearsals where we focused on our movements/dances and listening for our cues.

Talk to me about...music, instruments, movement and sound.

We have been reading...Above and Below by Hanaka Clublow.

Talk to me about...money.

Words to use...coins, notes, how many, greater than, less than.

Tips for the week...can you practise Year 1 common exception words?

We have been reading...Ruby's Worry by Tom Percival .

<u>YEAR 3</u>

Talk to me about... my learning on 'Light'.

Words to use...transparent, translucent, opaque, reflective, fair test.

Tips for the week...We have been reinforcing our learning that in a fair test, we only change one variable and all of the other variables must stay the same.

We have been reading...The Wild Robot by Peter Brown.

YEAR 5

Talk to me about...the importance of fundraising and thinking of others.

Words to use...caring, team work, supporting others.

Tips for the week...remember to keep practising your times tables and mental arithmetic skills

We have been singing...Charlie and the Chocolate Factory songs in preparation for our performances.

Talk to me about...musical instruments.

Words to use... hoist, nervous, observe, joyful.

Tips for the week... practise doubling numbers to 10.

We have been reading... Once we were giants by Martin Waddell and Captain Pugwash animation – Monster Ahoy.

YEAR 2

Talk to me about.. adding -es to words to make a plural.

Words to use..... drop the y, add i, add -es, add s, words ending in x, ch, z or sh.

Tips for the week When something is divided into 4 equal parts, each part is called a quarter. We can write it as a fraction ¹/₄.

We have been reading...Journey by Aaron Becker and James and the Giant Peach by Roahl Dahl.

<u>YEAR 4</u>

Talk to me about... KS2 production, Athens and Sparta, changes in puberty, periods and interpreting line graphs and bar charts.

Words to use... Athens, Sparta, city state, puberty, periods, line graphs, bar charts and interpreting.

Tips for the week... continue to learn your Year 3/4 common exception words and times tables.

We have been reading... The case of the vanishing granny by Alexander McCall Smith.


YEAR 6

Talk to me about... the animal I researched for the Zootopia project.

Words to use...species, habitat, diet, height, weight.

Tips for the week... get plenty of rest before the residential next week!

We have been reading... a selection of poems from the poetry books in the classroom.
